Program Overview

Grades 1, 2, 3, 4

There is a mandatory two-year (Level I and II) preparatory program for First Holy Communion. During the first year of preparation, children are taught by their own parents at home. Registration is generally the second week of September. Parents gather for an Enrollment Prayer Service and three instructional meetings; children gather for Advent and Lenten activities. At the start of the second year, children are placed in classes with a catechist. There is a First Reconciliation preparation and the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation in Gr. 2. Students in Grades 2 through 4 participate in Advent and Lenten Prayer Services which introduce students to different types of prayer and help them recognize and become comfortable with their parish/church community.

Grades 5, 6

An emphasis is placed on receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, social ministry, and special Advent and Lenten programs in the Church. Some activities include Praying the Rosary for fifth graders, The Jesse Tree for sixth graders during Advent, and the Stations of the Cross designed for children during Lent. Sixth Grade students are required to complete an assessment designed to evaluate a student's understanding of the doctrine taught. This Assessment, which is takehome is given in January.

Grades 7, 8

There is a mandatory two-year preparatory program for Confirmation. Emphasis is placed on social ministry and service, Mass attendance, and parent/sponsor involvement. Level I candidates for Confirmation participate in an Evening of Recollection and Level II candidates have a Retreat experience prior to Confirmation. Students in both 7th and 8th Grade are given a workbook to include a series of reflections on various experiences which must be completed and submitted by the last day of classes.

COMMUNICATION

We envision the Faith Formation of children as a cooperative effort of parents, catechists, coordinators and the parish community. Your presence, support, and participation are always welcome. We encourage parents to be in communication with your child's catechist and Catechetical Leader. The Faith Formation Office will communicate with parents through mail and letters sent home with students. There will also be notices placed in the Sunday Bulletin that will inform parents of upcoming events.

FAITH FORMATION CLASSES

Classes are held weekly: Monday through Friday afternoons or evenings, and Saturday and Sunday mornings. Classes meet at the St. Lawrence School Building or in catechists' (teachers') homes. Classes run from September through April.

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults are initiated into the Catholic Church. The RCIA process was restored after the Second Vatican Council as the way to prepare adults for Baptism. It is provided for:

- -Those who are not baptized and express a desire to learn more about Catholic beliefs and practices.
- -All those who are baptized in another Christian denomination and wish to explore membership in the Catholic Church.
- -Catholics who have been baptized but have not, as yet celebrated the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist and/or Confirmation.

RCIA ADAPTED FOR CHILDREN

"Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of Heaven belongs to such as these." Matthew 19:14

RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation adapted for Children) is open to all children between the ages of 7-17, whether baptized or unbaptized. Children will be prepared to receive the sacraments they have missed since Baptism. These classes also will serve as education for those children who are wishing to join the Catholic Church. Whether your family is just entering the Church or is returning after a time away, all are welcome.

Children over the age of 7 who have not been baptized are invited into the process of Christian Initiation based on the Adult Rite of Christian Initiation.

RCIC is a spiritual journey of conversion in which children become full members of the Church.

Catholics Returning Home

Catholics Returning Home is a program for adult Catholics who have left the active practice of their faith and who are seeking answers to questions about returning to the Church. The program consists of informal sharing and an update of the Catholic faith. It meets on six consecutive Monday evenings beginning in January. CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Children in grades 2 through 6 are invited to experience the Liturgy of the Word With Children at the 9:00 AM Mass on designated Sundays. During the Liturgy of the Word portion of the Mass, the children are brought to the Bethany Center where they will hear the Readings for Mass from a Children's Lectionary followed by a homily suited to their age-level. Prior to the Communion Rite, they will return to their families for the remainder of the Mass. The Program begins in October and continues through April. Please consult the Church bulletin for a schedule.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

At the beginning of the summer there is an opportunity for children 4-8 years of age to experience a one week high energy Bible-centered program. Each day children travel with their small group through various stations of learning activities, crafts, singing, snacks, and prayer. Registration for this program takes place in May.

YOUTH MINISTRY

Youth, Grade 6 and up are encouraged to join this dynamic youth ministry program which offers social, educational, service, and spiritual experiences. Meetings are held on Sunday evenings. Check the Sunday Bulletin for updates.

PRESCHOOL PROGRAMS

During Advent and Lent special programs are offered for preschool-aged children. These programs are advertised through the Church bulletin.

POLICIES

CLASS CANCELLATION

For class cancellation due to inclement weather, please tune in to WALK FM or News12 for building closings.

CLASS PLACEMENT

Catechists will notify families of class placement, (day of week and time) in September. Please call the Office of Faith Formation with any concerns regarding placement. Any change of address or phone number should be given immediately to the Office of Faith Formation.

CLASSROOM USAGE

All property should be respected and not disturbed. Classroom desks should not be defaced, and books, supplies, teacher and student belongings should not be touched.

DRESS CODE

Appropriate clothing must be worn at all times. Footwear with wheels on them is not permitted in the building.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Children should not come to class with any electronic devices or toys.

EMERGENCY/FIRE PROCEDURE

In the event that the fire alarm sounds, all catechists and students will evacuate the building. Students will remain with their classes outside of and away from the building. Attendance will be taken. No one will be permitted to re-enter the building until the "all clear" signal is given by the fire department or a parish staff member.

CLASSROOM SNACKS

There will be no food or snacks given out during class. Rewards can be celebrated in many ways excluding food and should be held in conjunction with the Liturgical year (Advent, Christmas, Lent etc...).

BATHROOM

We encourage your child to use the bathroom before arriving to class. If there are any circumstances we need to know about, please call the Office of Faith Formation.

VANDALISM

Students caught vandalizing anywhere on school or parish property will be responsible for damages and may be removed from the program.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE

Any student found in possession of an illegal substance on school or parish property or at parish sponsored events will be immediately suspended from the program.

HOMEWORK

Homework may be given at the discretion of each catechist. Parents are expected to review lessons and assist with assignments.

PROGRESS REPORTS

Progress Reports will be issued, as needed.

VISITORS

No visitors will be allowed in the classroom or hallways unless they have prior authorization from the Director of Faith Formation. Parents and visitors should report directly to the Office of Faith Formation.

EARLY PICK-UP

Prior notification must be given to the Office of Faith Formation and the student's catechist. When you arrive, please report to the Office of Faith Formation to pick up your child.

ATTENDANCE / LATENESS

Classes meet each week for one hour. We realize that circumstances may arise that prevent a child from being at a class session. Please be aware that 3 absences will result in a phone call from the Office of Faith Formation. Since each grade level builds upon the previous one, if a child has excessive absences, he/she will be required to repeat the entire grade level. Please call the Office of Faith Formation and your child's catechist when your child must miss class or arrive late. A late pass must be obtained from the Office of Faith Formation for the student to be permitted to enter their class. Attendance is taken and recorded weekly.

ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL

- -All students are to be dropped off no earlier than 10 minutes prior to class and picked up promptly. Please exercise great care when dropping off your child for class and picking them up from class. Enter and exit the parking lot with great caution.
- -Children in grades 2 through 5 should be walked into the building by their parents. The entire class will walk up together to their classroom with the catechist. Children in grades 6 through 8 can enter the building and meet their catechist in the classroom.
- -Catechists for Gr. 2 through 5 will walk their class to the foyer for dismissal. Parents are to come into the building to retrieve their child.

CONDUCT/ DISCIPLINE POLICY

We expect courtesy and respect from our students at all times. Inappropriate conduct will not be tolerated. In the case of a student causing a disruption in class or displaying disrespectful behavior, these steps will be followed: After the first incident a verbal correction will be made by the Catechist. If the behavior continues, the student will then meet with the Director of Faith Formation and there will be parent notification. If the situation is not resolved, there may be a need to have a conference with the parents and the Director.

FIELD TRIPS

Parents will need to fill out permission forms each time students will be attending an event not on parish grounds. This usually applies to the years of Sacramental preparation for Confirmation where there is an opportunity for a retreat and service projects.

PHOTOGRAPHS / VIDEOS

Throughout the year, pictures of the children in the Faith Formation Program may be taken during various Faith Formation activities. In some cases, these photos or videos may be published in the Sunday Bulletin or displayed on posters or brochures promoting the Faith Formation Program. Permission forms for the use of photographs and videos must be signed and can be found at the end of this book. Any parent who does not wish the use of photographs should put this request in writing and send it to the Office of Faith Formation by the first day of classes.

CUSTODY ISSUES & ORDERS OF PROTECTION

Concerns regarding custody of a child should be communicated in writing to the director of our program. It is the parent's responsibility to inform the Director of any court-ordered decision regarding custodial arrangements.

MEDICAL CONDITIONS & ACCIDENTS

The Director of Faith Formation must be notified of special medical conditions (allergies, asthma, auditory/visual impairments, seizures) of any child. We will not dispense medication of any kind. If an exception must be made to administer an EPI Pen, the parent must provide a "Food Allergy Action Plan". A confidential appointment should be scheduled with the Director to discuss all special medical needs. In the event of an accident or incident, a step-by-step plan has been established and will be followed by the catechist and staff.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES

In the event of problems, questions or complaints regarding the classroom learning environment, the subsequent procedure should be followed: First consult with the Catechist. If satisfaction is not reached, contact the Director of Faith Formation.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL PARISH VOLUNTEERS

In order to insure the safety of our young people, all those individuals on our parish staff along with all who volunteer in any way for St.

Lawrence the Martyr Parish must first complete VIRTUS training and are required to submit to a criminal background check. Catechists must also sign a *Code of Conduct*, according to the Diocesan Child Protection Policy. The purpose of this Diocesan and Parish policy is to provide universal vigilance. We seek to provide an environment in which all are aware of the difference between appropriate and inappropriate behaviors, an environment in which all know the proper course of action to take when something raises concern. The VIRTUS training is designed to assist us in recognizing potential dangerous situations to order to insure the safety of children.

The times and places for VIRTUS training are listed each week in the Long Island Catholic and on the Diocesan Website at www.drvc.org. The Criminal Background check form may be obtained from the Parish Office.

SAFE ENVIROMENT POLICIES

In September 2003, the Diocesan Child Protection Policy was implemented in our parishes, schools, and agencies. Catechetical Leaders are to ensure that all who work and volunteer in Parish Faith Formation programs are in full compliance with these diocesan policies and procedures.

The USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (Article 12) directs dioceses to establish safe environment programs in cooperation with parents, civil authorities, educators, and the community to provide education and training for children, youth, parents, ministers, educators, and others. In New York State, the State Education Department includes personal safety education for children and youth in the mandated education curriculum for grades K-12. In the Diocese of Rockville Centre, our goal has been to go beyond the minimal requirement to create a safe environment for children and young people. Toward this end, the Office for the Protection of Children and Young People developed two programs in collaboration with the Office of Education and the Office of Faith Formation. The "Talk 2 Us" program urges youngsters to take a role in developing a safe environment by becoming active, involved, and informed participants in their surroundings. The second program, "How Can I Keep Fuzzie Safe?" introduces "Fuzzie", a stuffed animal, along with a booklet. The booklet is filled with discussion and exercises on how to keep Fuzzie safe, and in doing so teaches children about their own personal safety. To this end, it is highly recommended that all Catechetical Leaders present this information to all of the parents at the parent meeting. If a parent decides to opt out of such a program the Catechetical Leader and the Pastor will meet with the parent. St Lawrence the Martyr utilizes the "Fuzzie" program with first grade parents.

Diocesan Reporting Procedures:

When a complaint of sexual abuse of a child or minor is reported to any person working for the Church, the following should occur:

- They should inform their pastor, principal, or agency director;
- urge the complainant to notify the legal authorities immediately and assist them if they need help;
- and notify the diocesan Office for the Protection of Children and Young People at 516-678-5800, ext 573.

STEWARDSHIP: A Way Of Life

Each and every one of us has been given different gifts from God. Using our gifts wisely is pleasing to God. As families sometimes it's not what we say that influences our children but what we do with our time. Using our talents to give back to the Church and to others in our community may be one of the most valuable lessons to be passed on to our children. By living stewardship as a way of life, we are an example of the presence of God in our daily lives.

Here is a list of opportunities to help families make Stewardship, A Way of Life:

AT THE SUNDAY LITURGY

- <u>Children's Choir</u>: Serves weekly at the 9:00 a.m. Mass from October through June, and is open to boys and girls beginning in third grade. Children from the Youth Choir may be trained as Cantors for the Liturgy of the Word with Children, and as Cantors for the congregation. Please contact Marie Winn at 589-0042, ext 23.
- Altar Server: Serves weekly at all Masses, by schedule, all year round and is open to boys and girls beginning in the fourth grade. Registration forms are available in the Rectory Office and should be returned to Fr. Brian Ingram. Training generally begins in October.
- <u>Greeter</u>: Serves at the 9:00 a.m. Mass and is open to boys and girls beginning in the fourth grade. Call the Office of Faith Formation at 589-3160 to register.
- <u>Junior Lector</u>: For children in the sixth grade and up, to read for the Family Mass and during the Liturgy of the Word with Children, both at the 9:00 a.m. Mass by schedule. Training sessions are in October. Please call the Office of Faith Formation at 589-3160.

OUTREACH TO THOSE IN NEED

- <u>Loaves and Fishes Weekend</u>: Second Sunday of every month food is collected at all the Masses and may be left by the doors of the Church.
- <u>Thanksgiving Baskets</u>: Dinner fixings for a family of four for Thanksgiving is gathered and brought to the Parish Hall on the weekend before Thanksgiving for distribution to those in need in our community.
- Operation Christmas Child/Shoebox Program: Age and boy/girl appropriate boxes are assembled with small gifts, treats and toiletries and dropped off at the Office of Faith Formation or Rectory in early November. Catechists have been given the information which will also be posted in the bulletin starting in October.
- Christmas Star Program/Adopt a Family: Parish outreach gathers requests from children and adults of those in need from our community and places them on stars in baskets at the doors of the church in late November/early December. Gifts are due back on the Friday before Christmas. Look to the bulletin for more information during the Advent Season.
- <u>The Mary Connors Memorial Walk for Children</u>: During the Lenten Season, sponsored children walk down Handsome Avenue by police escort to raise money for Parish Outreach who helps the families in need in our community. Information is distributed by catechists in the spring and posted in the bulletin.
- <u>Operation Rice Bowl</u>: Small cardboard bowls are used to collect loose change during the Lenten season and all money is donated to those in need in other countries. Information is distributed by Catechists in the spring and posted in the bulletin.
- <u>Lenten Soup Supper</u>: A gathering of parishioners eat a meal of donated soups and bread just prior to Holy Week. All donations go the "Having Friends Inn" Soup Kitchen. Consult the Church bulletin during Lent for more information.
- Mother's Day Baby Shower
 Parishioners are asked to bring gifts for babies at all the Masses on Mother's Day. The gifts are then passed on to those in need.

The National Directory of Catechesis suggests that effective catechesis also incorporates learning "by heart." As it explains, "For centuries the living tradition of the faith was handed on principally through the oral tradition. In order to learn the principal truths of the faith, [instruments for transmitting the faith] were easily committed to memory in lieu of textbooks or other printed materials and could be recalled often as the basis of catechetical instruction."

HOW TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

- We make an Examination of Conscience.
- Enter the confessional and kneel or sit either behind the screen or in the chair in front of the priest.
- Make the Sign of the Cross saying: Bless me Father ,for I have sinned.
- Tell the priest how long it has been since your last confession or if it is your first confession.
- Tell the priest your sins.
- Let the priest know when you are finished so that he can now speak to you. Listen to what the priest has to say.
- Recite the Act of Contrition when asked by the priest.
- The priest will give you a penance which may either be prayers to recite or he may give you something to do. Remember what he gives to you.
- Listen to the beautiful Prayer of Absolution and make the Sign of the Cross.
- Thank the priest before leaving the confessional.

HOW TO RECEIVE THE HOLY EUCHARIST

Attendance at weekly Mass and sharing the Eucharist is the foundation of our spiritual life. As Catholics we believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. We should receive the Lord with reverence. There are two ways in which you may receive: On the tongue or in your hand. If you receive on the tongue, approach the Priest or Minister and make a simple bow. After you have said "Amen", extend your tongue allowing the Host to be placed there before closing your mouth. If receiving in the hand, approach the Priest or Minister and make a simple bow. After saying "Amen", place an open hand on top of the other making a throne for the Blessed Sacrament to be placed. With your lower hand carefully take the Sacrament from your hand and place it in your mouth. If receiving the Precious Blood, approach the minister and make a small bow. After saying "Amen", allow the minister to present the Chalice to you. Take a small sip and return the Chalice to the minister.
